

### **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

#### What is an emergency?

An emergency is a situation which poses an immediate risk to health, life, property or the environment.

- Most emergencies require swift action to prevent the situation from getting worse.
- Being prepared and educated about disasters empowers all of us to help ourselves and our workers stay safe.





# PURPOSE OF EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS & RESPONSE

- 1. Any organization shall identify, establish and maintain potential emergency situations that could affect their organization. An Emergency Response Plan shall be developed
- 2. As far as practicable, prepare steps to prevent or mitigate the emergency situations.
- 3. Where prevention is not possible, plan the organization's response to the identified emergency situations. This include necessary preparation to respond during the emergency situation.
- 4. Lastly, recover from emergency situation in a safe & healthy manner

PLAN, PREPARE, RESPOND, RECOVER

# PURPOSE OF EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS & RESPONSE

Identify	Identify potential emergency situations
Reduce	Reduce/Minimise the risks of emergencies occurring
Develop, implement, and test	Develop, implement, and test plans to respond promptly and effectively to emergencies
Minimize	Minimize the impact of emergencies on the People, Environment, Asset, Reputation (P.E.A.R)
Improve	Continually improve emergency preparedness and response procedures
